- ◆ **SILICONE** Regular silicone is the softest implant and is often a good choice for women who want the softest feel.
- ◆ **GUMMY BEAR** The 'gummy bear' implant comes in both round and teardrop shapes. They have a firmer gel, which may give a better shape and may last longer. The round gummy bear implant is often a good choice for women with looser tissues and who want a more durable implant that remains soft. The teardrop shaped gummy bear implant may be a good choice for women with particular tissue types, are relatively tight and desire a very proportionate and natural looking enhancement with less fullness of the upper portion of the breast and more projection and fullness of the lower portion of the breast.
